Hello, world! Today, we here at Team HERMES have some momentous news to share with you all: HERMES Mail is on the launchpad and final preparations are made for liftoff. What this means in concrete terms is that we now have source code that compiles, links with the Stingray library, runs, and does not immediately crash; the software successfully displays, sends, and checks electronic mail; and, in summation, is in a state approaching (but not /yet/ meeting) that in which Eudora 7.1 found itself at the moment of its discontinuation by Qualcomm. There remain a few display bugs (notably, toolbars do not display, although they do work when clicked); most crucially, message composition is not yet in a working state, which renders our software unsaleable in its present condition—but we are working hard to change that.

Those of you whose faith in us persisted for all these years, on behalf of Team HERMES, please accept my deepest gratitude. We have not forgotten you—especially not those of you who contributed your time or hard-earned cash to the cause. At the inception of this project, we solemnly undertook to send each and every one of our backers electronic copies of the alpha and beta releases of HERMES Mail 8.0 "Aurora" as soon as those milestones were met; this is a commitment we did not make lightly, and one we fully intend to honour. Those of you who now intend to contribute, or to make a further contribution, we will reward similarly; details on how this is to be done are forthcoming.

Getting HERMES Mail into saleable condition, as detailed above, is our prime priority. Our second, after the initial alpha (test) build is released to our backers, will be under-the-bonnet feature improvements and additions; but we will never stray from the basic framework that made Eudora such a joy to use in the first place. All these are surmountable obstacles; the primary check on our progress to date has been the psychological difficulty inherent in recruiting people in the light of the foregoing, particularly during the time of Covid.

The human aversion to the risk of a "sunk cost trap" is natural, reasonable, and foreseeable, though that did not make it any less of a disappointment. A secondary, internal obstacle soon arose, waxing with every month that dragged by and every deadline missed: namely, a sense of despair that the project would ever get off the ground, much less fly. Part of this stemmed ultimately from the legal action before the Federal Court of Canada in relation to Covid benefits in-lieu-of-pay; the case seemed interminable for procedural reasons, which was dispiriting, to say the least.

Looking toward the more distant future, the greatest hurdle ahead of us is now strictly monetary. Last year, when it became manifest that HERMES Mail was tenable as a going concern, I absorbed the cost of the Stingray toolkit from my personal funds, notwithstanding the litigation. The balance of our crowdfunded start-up capital, all five thousand dollars and change, was wholly swallowed by the overhead: keeping the lights on and the fires burning while we spun our wheels was becoming too expensive for comfort. -- Nicholas Edward Werner-Matavka
