Work on HERMES Mail has progressed to the extent that we have a launch date. A revolution in personal e-Mail that runs on \*your\* computer and is in \*your\* control is set to begin on 1 August of this year.

No more stop-gap measures; our transitional HERMES toolkit obviated the need for clumsy workarounds like Stunnel, and our final software package (provisionally named Aurora) will allow Windows users once again to have an enterprise-class, multilingual POP3 and IMAP client in their hands. This is the ideal software for anyone who is hesitant to allow unaccountable tech titans, like Google and Microsoft, control over their private mail; it is also ideal for those who want to keep a seemingly unstoppable torrent of junk mail in check.

Given what has happened in the past, it must be noted that this is a FIRM launch date. We are not in the vapourware-peddling business; we are in the communications business, and this software represents an iron-clad guarantee that the historical Eudora for Windows codebase is in safe hands.

That said, this will be a soft launch: we will release to testers first (alpha), then to this group and perhaps other trusted users (beta), and finally to the public (gamma). Doesn't sound like the "fullness of time" will arrive by October 1st...

What about plain "OAuth", though (not "OAuth2")? I thought somebody here made the distinction that the Oct. 1 requirement is for plain OAuth.

As noted earlier,

there are other Modern Auth options besides OAuth2 for MS email after Oct 1. It is only "Basic Auth" that is being disabled.

The "App Password" with some form of 2FA [app or phone] should work if your IT dept will support it. If they won't, then off you go to Pandora, at least until Hermes is able to add OAuth2 support in the future. And if we find out that MS email won't support these lesser forms of Modern Auth, then off to Pandora go I, too.

Modern authentication is an umbrella term for a combination of authentication and authorization methods that include: Authentication methods: Multi-factor Authentication; Client Certificate-based authentication. Authorization methods: Microsoft's implementation of Open Authorization (OAuth).
